Spelling


This week, we're revisiting the -ed suffix which is often used to change the form of a verb to the past tense (eg walk to walked). For each of the words you need to add the –ed suffix to the root word.

However....his week's spellings also recap three of our key spelling rules: double up for a short vowel sound, drop the **e**, drop the **y** for an **i**. This means you need to do the correct thing to the root word.

On Friday, I'd like you to do a spelling test. Choose four words from this list and four from the previous lists. Choose words from the third column of this table for the test.

| Spelling rule | Root word | Simple past tense |
|---------------------|-----------|-------------------|
| just add suffix | groan | groaned |
| just add suffix | splash | splashed |
| double up | grin | grinned |
| double up | drop | dropped |
| drop the e | stumble | stumbled |
| drop the e | confuse | confused |
| drop the y for an i | hurry | hurried |
| drop the y for an i | tidy | tidied |
